Multimedia Presentation Inclusive Design Planner

Title of media: Punctuation Interactive Book

Literacy skill/objective/topic: Punctuation to add expression to reading – periods, exclamation marks, question marks, commas, quotation marks, apostrophe for contractions, apostrophe for possession, ellipses

H5P Content Type(s): Interactive Book – made up of accordions, videos, and interactive activities in a course presentation

General description: This interactive book will teach the above punctuation marks with a focus on how the marks change the way the words and phrases are read aloud. Each page will teach a different punctuation mark or concept. The lessons need to be read in order, as each lesson will build on the other. The main parts of each page will be videos teaching the skill and interactive activities to practice the skill. Before and after the video, there will be accordions with suggestions of activities that teachers may choose to do. Since these will be in accordions, they will be tucked away and not cause a distraction to the learner. All the interactive activities will be on the final page (summary) together – possibly a new activity as well that incorporates all of the punctuation, such as sorting out the ending marks.
